FOREWORD

This infobase and its linked sub-infobases were initially prepared in 1991. The "Revision date" on the "information" screen under "File", above, indicates when additions, revisions, corrections etc. were last made.

This infobase was primarily designed to be viewed on screen, with printing only an occasional, secondary consideration. When printed (or converted to Adobe Acrobat PDF file format), use the specially formatted version of this infobase. Otherwise, the right edges of many images may be truncated and not fit on the page.

INTRODUCTION

The only known photographs taken at the mines are these amateur snapshots from the family [photo albums\(6\)](#) of my father, **Gerald Hathaway Dow ("Jerry")** [RN 7], and his brother, my uncle, **Edgar Lawrence Dow II** [RN 17]. The [latter\(7\)](#) were made available to me by my cousin, **Edgar Lawrence Dow III** ("Ted") [RN 19].

Except for those pictures in which my grandfather, **Edgar Lawrence Dow I** [RN 15] appears, most of these pictures were taken by him. All of these snapshots were taken with a very large [Folding Pocket Kodak Camera](#) (the camera, in its case, can be seen in [this photograph of my grandfather on his horse](#)), were of poor quality (many are not sharply in focus - lenses were not the best in those days and the focusing mechanism were pretty crude), were small (none were larger than 3-1/2" x 5") and were all pasted down in the photo albums. Most of these pictures were taken during the [summers\(8\)](#) of 1910 and 1911, although a few could have been as late as 1925 (my father appears in some to be perhaps as old as 15 years of age).

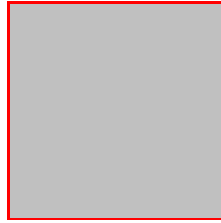
There is a noticeable difference in the quality of the snapshots taken in 1910 from those taken in June 1911. The 1910 pictures are darker, fuzzier, lack contrast and appear mostly out of focus. The few pictures that were taken later than 1911 are of much better quality than the 1910 and 1911 photos.

Some of these pictures were labelled with captions in the photo albums and I have included these in bold type with each such picture. Unfortunately, because these were taken long before I was born, many of the pictures and/or their content (particularly some people) can not be specifically identified or commented upon. Many of the name identifications I have included here were those made by my father in 1993 when I made copy negatives of the pictures in his family photo album. The one thing that can be said with some degree of certainty, though, is that they were all taken on the way to or from or while staying at the family mines (Ralston and Goggins) on the Ralston Divide in Placer County, California.

By the time I had made copy negatives of each of these pictures, additional resolution and sharpness was lost. Thus, the pictures included here are marginal in quality, at best. But they are the best we have and I am thankful that we have at least these images of this facet of our predecessors lives.

I was struck by the clothing being worn by members of my family in these pictures. It is obvious that my grandparents did not own "camp clothing" of the type my generation would have worn in a location such as these mines. Wearing a tie while on horseback on the trail getting to the mines is not my idea of "casual" or "western" wear. Going to and returning from the mines, they obviously wanted to be well dressed for the first class coach on the train, but on the trail or around camp their outfits are not my idea of "roughing it".

CAMERA



This 3-A Folding Pocket Kodak camera (model B-4 with a patent date of 1909) sported a Bausch & Lomb Optical Co. Rapid Rectilinear lens and a Kodak Ball Bearing shutter. The shutter release is at (A) and the shutter setting (B) options were T, B, 25, 50 and 100. A knurled knob was used to manually reset the exposure counter; the number appeared in a window (C) immediately next to the reset knob and it automatically advanced to the next number each time the shutter release (A) was pressed (or the Bulb was used). The diaphragm was adjusted by a pointer (F) with settings of 4, 8, 16, 32, 64, 128. The focusing mechanism consisted of a movable detent lever (E) that had positions for 6, 8, 10, 12, 15, 25, 50 and 100 feet. Once this mechanism is set, the bellows are adjusted to come out to hit the detent lever by pinching the knobs (D) towards each other and sliding the lens mount as far forward as possible. It is not surprising that many of the photographs in this infobase are out of focus.

The remainder of the people are unknown to me, although the other woman on the left in the back seat may either be my father's nanny or Mrs. Sidney Smith, wife of my grandfather's partner in the Piedmont Baths. June 1911. Note driver is adding water to radiator with a bucket; note the steam rising.

My father was age 3-1/2 and his brother age 17-1/2 in June 1911.

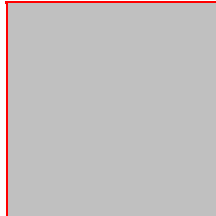

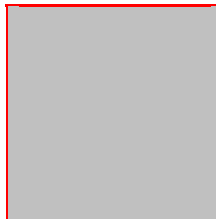
RALSTON COTTAGE 1911

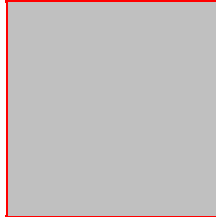

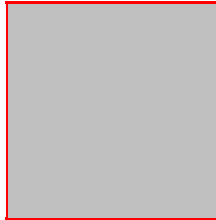

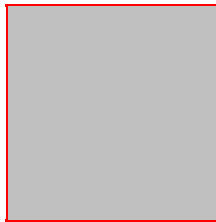

The boy, my father **Gerald Hathaway Dow ("Jerry")** [RN 7] at age 2-1/2 in 1910. It is possible the woman is Mrs. Sidney Smith, wife of my grandfather's partner in the Piedmont Baths (the woman in this picture looks very much like the [woman on the hammock](#) that my father in 1993 identified as Mrs. Smith). It is very difficult to be certain who this woman is, but the caption would indicate it is Emily. Note also the face of Edgar Jr. on the hammock

It is also possible the woman is Mrs. Sidney Smith, wife of my grandfather's partner in the Piedmont Baths. The wagon driver is unidentified and it is uncertain who the woman standing on the right is, but it could be my grandmother, Emily (if it is, it is one of the few pictures I have ever seen of her where she was really smiling!). The viewer will have to draw their own conclusions about the identification of some of these women's pictures - hats and dresses are the best clues.

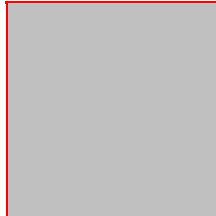

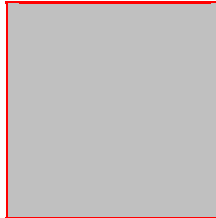

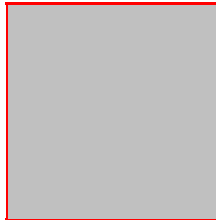

It is not known if the "first ride" described was at the time this picture was taken or whether it had occurred at an earlier age - the page had no date recorded, but it undoubtedly was in 1908 or later. It states: "Baby's First Ride was made on Brady his Daddy's saddle horse at the mine."(56)

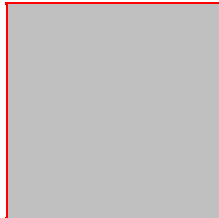

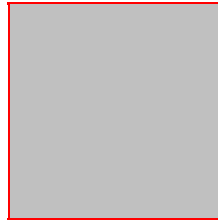

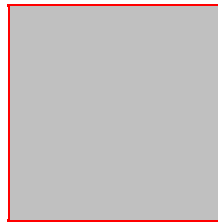
